

Community Leaders of Africa Federation, Kampala Jamaat, & Bilal School, Honorable Guests, - Salaamun Alaikum! My name is Mohamed Hussein Punjani, Chairman of Punjani Foundation in Canada. I've travelled many miles across the ocean to be here today and feel honoured & privileged that Allah has given me the strength and courage to join you all in person for the opening ceremony of this wonderful school building. Returning here today to my birth country brings back many emotional memories from about 60 years ago, when we opened a health clinic in this very compound. I remember recording that moment on video, the first of its kind at that time. That clinic was built by my close friend, Marhoom Habib Bhai Walji, truly a man of God! This building, having undergone a change of use, still stands, benefitting and serving our com-

when I moved from Bukoba to Kampala in the 1960s. We worked together for the community for many years, even when we moved to London, collecting funds door to door - where we opened our first mosque in Hammersmith.

Today, I also remember and miss past respected leaders like Ebrahim Bhai Kassam, Mulla Nanji, and Habib Kara, who all gave back to our community & with whom I had close ties. May Allah bless them all. I thank you all for allowing us the opportunity to help build this secondary school. I'm also pleased to confirm our pledge to fully furnish the school. With the blessing of your Education Board, we are also planning to set up and equip a modern computer and IT center within this building much like we have done through our NGO in Tanzania. Our Board has passed the chairmanship of our NGO in Tanzania to Dr. Riyaz Hassanali who will Insha'Allah work closely with our foundation to expand our educational programs throughout Africa - with his vision of modern education using technology to benefit the youths. We want our young people to learn, grow, and do well in life. Nothing makes me happier and prouder than seeing our students succeed - so that they can go on to help their families and eventually give back to their communities. Helping others has always been part of our family values. I pray that my children and grandchildren will continue this legacy of good work even when I am not there. We shall always support the cause of the most needy and underprivileged in society, especially orphans & education. Special thanks go to the esteemed leadership of our Kampala Jamaat under Shabbar Virani, Bilal Academy under Mustafa Kanji and the Building Committee under Sibtain Merchant and all who have worked tirelessly to help complete this project in record time of 6 months! I would also like to recognise the support of the Africa Federation, under the chairmanship of Amine Nassor, Vice Chairman Aunali Khalfan, Housing Development Board Chairman Akil Hirji and overall guidance of past Chairman & Trustee Shabir Najafi, in making this project a reality. Thank you all for welcoming me and my family with so much love and respect and making us part of your family here in Uganda!



### Speech by Dr. Riyaz Hassanali Chairman Punjani Charitable Trust Tanzania

Bismillah-ir-Rahman-ir-Rahim.

Distinguished guests, community elders, brothers and sisters, Salaamun Alaikum.

Today, we come together to celebrate something truly special — the opening of a school that not only represents bricks and mortar, but vision, heart, and legacy.

This school is being established in honor of the Punjani charitable trust, led by none other than Mohamed Hussein Punjani — a man whose life story reflects entrepreneurship, foresight, and extraordinary.

Throughout his career as a successful businessman, Mohamedbhai supported countless initiatives for the betterment of our Khoja community. But what makes today even more meaningful is what he has come to realize in recent years: that legacy is not just about recognition, but about inspiring others — especially his own children and grandchildren — to use their wealth and talent for the greater good. Three years ago, I recognized that the world was on the verge of something monumental — a transformation unlike anything before:

The Fourth Industrial Revolution.

While most of the world was still reeling from COVID-19, few understood what was already unfolding. The rise of artificial intelligence, robotics, data science, and automation would soon change everything — especially in underdeveloped nations that lacked access to tools and knowledge to prepare. One evening, I sat down with Mohamedbhai to share this concern.

I told him:

"This change is coming fast – and our community may be left behind if we don't act now."

Without hesitation, he looked at me and said:

"What will it take to make this knowledge accessible?"

That very night, he opened his heart – and his checkbook – and said,

"Let's start now."

But it wasn't just him. It required full support from his children: Salim, Fatim, Gulam, Shafiq, and Minaz. Together, they embraced this bold vision, and from that unity, the first school was born.

We were also blessed to meet Mirjean Pirbhai, who helped transform the dream into a structured institution — one that could deliver not only education, but excellence.

Today, we offer courses in AI, data science, cybersecurity, and other essential fields that are shaping the future.

We made this bold move because we saw those traditional professions – law, finance, even medicine – will be transformed by AI.

I am also pleased to share the outcomes of the 4th Cybersecurity Forum organized two days back by the ICT Commission Tanzania where PCTT attended as invitee. The forum highlighted the urgent need to enhance capacity building and for the ICT Commission to engage, promote, invite investors in the area of cybersecurity and support start up project for young entrepreneurs.

We have made significant strides with the Punjani project, connecting with key stakeholders such as Digital4Tanzania, a Twining Project between Finland and Tanzania, fully funded by the EU. This project aims to train Tanzanians on cybersecurity, data protection, and enhancing the digital economy. The project will be delivered under the ICT Commission within the Incubation hub that Punjani will be taking part under an MoU.

Furthermore, we connected with TZ-CERT (Tanzania Computer Emergency Response Team), which has been instrumental in strengthening Tanzania's cybersecurity backbone. TZ-CERT's excellence has earned Tanzania the second place in Africa in the Global Cybersecurity.

We are proud to say that over 1000 students have already been trained through this initiative. A drone assembly plant and services project are being studied, with partners from India, the US, and Taiwan.

This project aims to transform agriculture and border surveillance in Africa, creating jobs in drone piloting, AI software development, hardware repairs, and support.

But we are also disappointed that very few were from our own Khoja community.

The numbers don't lie:

Over 300 million jobs are expected to be replaced by AI and robotics.

This is not fearmongering. This is fact.

So today, I ask our leaders, our elders, our parents:

Let us not wait. Let us act now.

The change is not coming in decades. It is coming in the next five years.

This new school in Kampala is not just a gift – it's an opportunity.

An opportunity to prepare our children, and even our adults, for the future.

An opportunity made possible by the Punjani Family Foundation — but it will only be successful if we use it.

Let's come together and fulfill the dream of Mohamedbhai — a dream to see our community not just survive, but thrive in the world ahead.

May our children and grandchildren speak of this day with pride,

Just as we speak of the sacrifices made by those who came before us.

Thank you for listening.

And Insha'Allah, I look forward to returning here one day

To see a thriving center of excellence – a new source of pride for our community.
